WORSHIP THEME - Forgiveness has no limits

This week in worship we have been thinking about our new theme of forgiveness. We started the week by thinking about times when we have broken things. Mrs Harvey told us about the time she broke her Nan's teapot and the glass in her neighbour's greenhouse when she was little. The children reflected on the different ways that we can say sorry and how sometimes it is possible to fix what we have broken.

The children were read the parable of The Selfish Servant. The King forgave his servant when he was unable to pay the King the money he owed. The King took pity on him and let him off the debt so he did not have to go to jail. The servant then went and found another servant who owed him money and insisted he pay him immediately. He did not show the kindness and forgiveness that the King had shown him. When the King found out how the servant had behaved he was furious and wanted to know why he had asked for forgiveness but was not willing to show forgiveness to others.

God is always willing to forgive us however many times we ask. God wants us to treat others in this way and asks that if we want to be forgiven that we need to forgive others too.

PLUMPTON VISIT



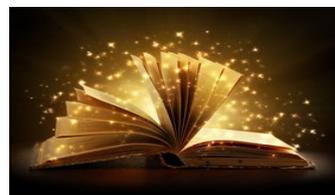
